Bernini versus Michelangelo

We will be discussing the validity of these critical responses to Bernini's sculpture of Constantine (unveiled 1669) on St. Peter's Scala Reggia (erected between 1663-66), in the context of the standards of classical antiquity and Michelangelo.

Pay particular attention to such values as decorum, the nude and draped figure, the expression of action and emotion, and the "rules" of sculptural practice.

Francis Haskell and Nicholas Penny's <u>Taste and the Antique</u> (in department) is a good reference work for the canon of ancient sculpture.
