- Consolidating links with the European Commission, including organizing a speech in College delivered by European Commissioner Joaquin Almunía (EU Commissioner responsible for Economic and Monetary Affairs).
- Tying TCD's Centre for European Studies with the prestigious Council for European Studies at Columbia University.
- Ensuring transparency and effectiveness in European Studies' governance, by way of regular meetings with the ES Management Committee.
