# Assessment Students give two presentations <u>and</u> students submit a portfolio/journal of weekly assignments. Details

Or students write a critical analysis of a text of their choice.

#### Assessment

Presentations constitute 40% (20 marks for each presentation) of the overall mark for this module.

20 marks are assigned for each of two presentations

The journal (or essay) constitutes 60% of the overall mark. The mark assigned to the journal rewards ongoing work invested in the course: reading done, thoughts had in preparation for seminars/presentations, thoughts had during/after the presentations and lectures. It rewards engagement and participation in the process of thinking about issues raised during the course.

# Assessment of Essay

Students write a critical analysis of a text of their choice. The presentation and structuring of the essay is not fixed in stone. The analysis is marked in the same way as a conventional essay.
