The World War 1 Road Show is a partnership between RTE, Trinity College Dublin, and the National Library of Ireland.



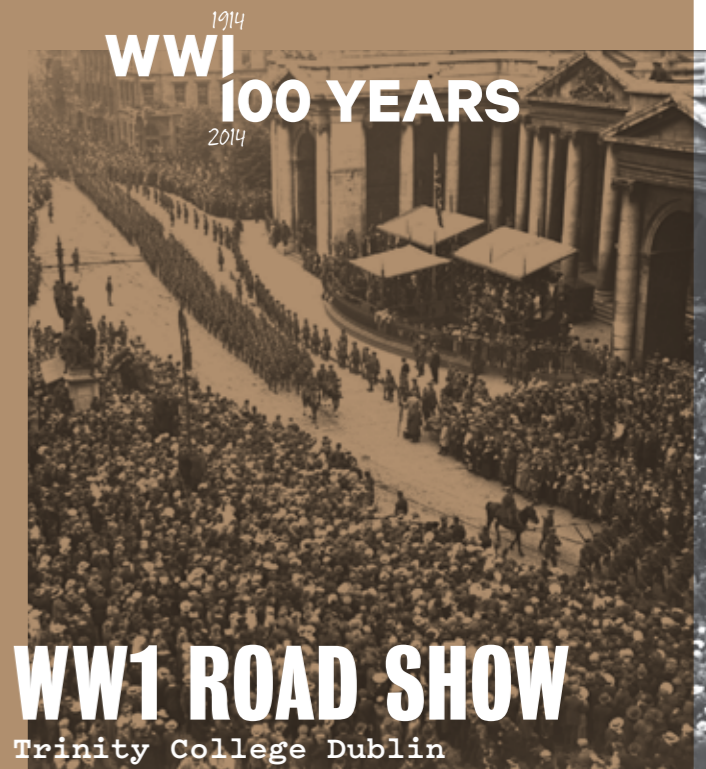
