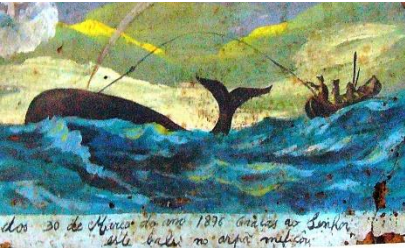

- Integrating population and ecological modelling into marine historical ecology;
- Historical case studies from Asia, Africa, and Central and South America;
- Historical scientific expeditions around the world.

Participation The conference is open to all students and researchers interested in the history of human interactions with life in the ocean.

Our goal is to enhance knowledge and understanding of how the diversity, distribution and abundance of marine life in the world's oceans have changed over the long term to better indicate future changes and possibilities.



We strive to engage paleo-ecologists, climatologists, social scientists, archaeologists, historians, ecologists, and biologists under the unifying view of our oceans as social-ecological systems, wherein people and the natural world are intrinsically coupled.

OPI is connected with the COST Action Oceans Past Platform (2015-2018) that aims to determine the socio-economic, political, cultural and ecological implications of human impacts on marine life, and to develop historical descriptors and indicators for marine and coastal management.
