International Peace Studies examines the sources of war and armed conflict and suggests methods of preventing and resolving them through peacemaking and peacebuilding. The programme combines perspectives from international relations, politics and ethics to reflect critically on the wide range of social, political and economic issues associated with peace and conflict. The ISE is unique in Trinity and in Ireland, in having a Dublin and Belfast campus. Many of our graduates find work in NGOs, foreign affairs, the civil service and international organizations, or continue with PhD studies.
