Note:

- Details of pre-registration for modules, including the internship module will be sent to students in late summer/early Autumn.
- Details of applying for IPS internship module and registration for it will be emailed to all students in early September
- Details of IPS Internship module will be provided on October 3
- There are no lectures during Reading Week, week 7 in each semester
- Please note that most **seminars** begin in the second week of each semester.
- Modules in red are IT&IS modules, modules in black are IPS modules, modules in blue are provided by non-ISE departments in Trinity and modules in green are shared IPS and IT&IS modules.
- Students are free to take up to 2 modules from other ISE MPhils, as well as the non-ISE modules. There are some clashes of modules, but these are unavoidable (outside timetabling with non-ISE departments)
- One additional module is not timetabled yet 'Russia-EU Relations ' (European Studies) and one module time is not confirmed yet, Europe and its Other(s): Ideas, identities and symbolic geographies in Europe.

- **EM7433 Conflict Transformation**, will run in Belfast November 21, 1pm start - 29 November, This is an intensive module and three days are residential in Corrymeela, Northern Ireland, followed by a weekend off, then 3 days of class in ISE Belfast, Monday-Wednesday, November 27-29, with the remainder of week in ISE Belfast. Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. It is also at student's own cost and non-EU students must arrange their own visas. Students taking this module will be excused from class in Dublin that week. Further details will be distributed of place allocation and module content in Autumn

- **EM7491 Religions and Ethics in a Pluralist World** will be taught as an intensive module over the 5 days in September 2017: 13-15 Sept. 11.00 a.m. – 5.00 p.m.; 18 Sept. 11.00 a.m. – 5.00 p.m. and 19 Sept. 10.00 – 1.00 p.m., preceding Orientation Day (22 September). Seminars for this module will take place throughout the **semester**.

- **EM7484 Judaism and Jewish-Christian Relations** will be taught as an intensive module over 4 days preceding the start of the second semester, 8-11 January 2018.

- **EM7101 Europe and its Other(s): Ideas, identities and symbolic geographies in Europe** runs for 2 semesters. IPS students may take it for 1st semester for 10ECTS, or for both semesters for 20 ECTS

- **Trinity International Development Initiative (TIDI) Seminars** will take place on Fridays, 13:00. Although this is not a module that can be taken for credit, ISE students are welcome to attend.
