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
International Cooperation on Climate Change

- Much more effort is needed to avoid catastrophic climate change
- American leadership is vital
- Domestic politics continues to obstruct serious efforts moving forward



Average warming (C) projected by 2100





Environmental Voting by Party (1970-2015)






American Public Opinion on Climate Change

Policy Responses in the Face of Adversity

Overcoming the GOP "Wall"

- Executive Branch has been forced to circumvent Congress
- Clean Power Plan
- State and local government policy responses
- Not a sustainable approach:
 - CPP is being challenged in the courts
 - Adaptation is extremely expensive
- For a comprehensive solution, Congressional action is necessary



Two Policy Futures

Implications of the Upcoming Election



- Promised to uphold Paris Agreement
- Defend & likely expand Clean Power Plan
- Apply further Executive powers
- Effectiveness will depend on the courts and Congress

Concluding Remarks

- The politicization of climate change has hampered serious efforts to combat the problem
- Congress cannot stand on the sidelines; it must act
- Upcoming elections are critical: President and Congress are key actors
- Bittersweet conclusion: Observed climate change is revealing the limits of partisanship
