Monday, 11 September, 4.45pm, Edmund Burke Theatre, Arts building



All postgrads are welcomed to join in this Clubs and Societies fair, enquire about the offerings each society has and perhaps even sign up to some clubs and societies for the coming year.



# **Map of Campus**




