ECU3-3031: Important Points to Note

- Check programme requirements and choose courses/modules THIS WEEK
- Very good evaluations in last five years. Usually 80 to 100 students take module
- Visiting students, if not registered by start of Week 4, email me (<u>johagan@tcd.ie</u>) so that I can add name to email list for ECU3-3031
- Many visiting students take ECU3-3031: 30 to 35 usually, from US and several European countries, which adds greatly I feel to the module. Plus, outgoing Irish students. Development on and very similar to EC2020.

- Lectures not compulsory but if attending NO talking at lectures: to allow other students to listen and hear properly.

- Average mark in this module around 58 (2.2), but about 45% get a 2.1 (60-69) and around 20% a 1st (70+)
