The assignment consists of writing a referee report on a paper chosen from the reading list (<u>starred papers ONLY</u>). Students are also encouraged to use other sources, such as related papers and textbooks, to evaluate the chosen article. The report (min. 1000 words, max 1500 words) will account for 15% of the overall grade.

The report should NOT consist of a summary of the article. The purpose of the assignment is to give you the possibility to critically evaluate an article and, possibly, to put forward your own ideas about extensions.

The deadline for the submission of the project will be 12 pm, Friday, 16th January 2009. Late submissions will incur a severe penalty.
