Teaching Council Registration - Degree Eligibility

- 1. All applicants to the PME must download, complete and submit on their TCD on-line application a Subject Self-Declaration form in respect of each subject being claimed as suitable for registration with the Teaching Council as part of their Level 8 or higher Degree. - 2. It is the responsibility of applicants to ensure their degree is eligible for the purposes of registration as a Post Primary teacher with the Teaching Council. Trinity College Dublin will not be held responsible if a graduate of the Professional Master of Education is refused admission to the Register of teachers on the basis of an erroneous declaration. To confirm that your degree is eligible you must consult the Teaching Council requirements.
- 3. TCD will not be responsible for checking any of this material on your behalf and will not be held responsible if an offer of a place is withdrawn because of inaccurate information supplied by you on your Subject Declaration forms or elsewhere. The onus is on the applicant to ensure that all questions on the Subject Declaration forms are completed accurately and truthfully and that the Credits/ECTS section is completed in **FULL** and that what is being claimed tallies with college course provision, in all cases. Any false claim or overestimate of degree credits/ECTS may lead to the withdrawal of an offer of a place later on.
