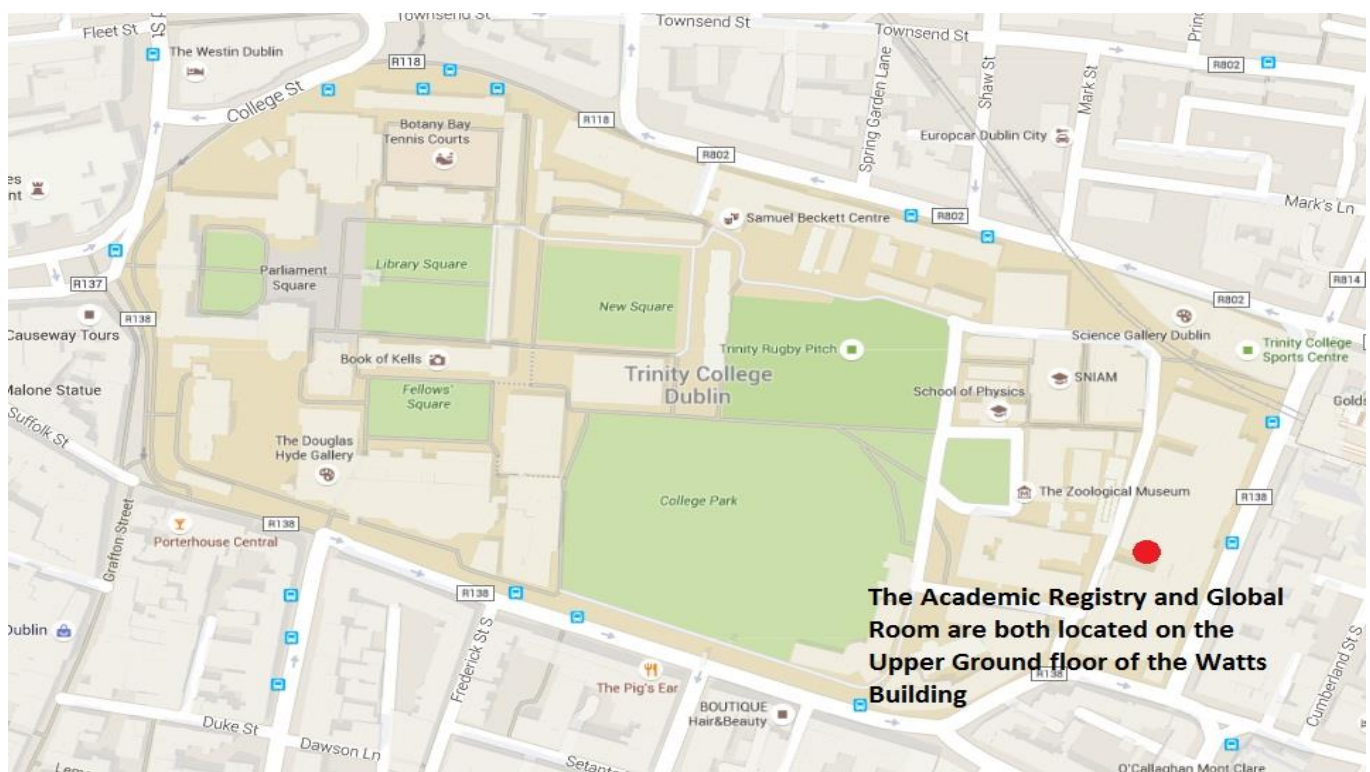
The Trinity Academic Year is divided into **two terms of 12 weeks each** – in **week 7** in each term there are no classes – these are reading weeks.

Michaelmas Term (First Term) starts on **Monday 26 September 2016** – ends on **Friday 16 December 2016**.

Hillary Term (Second Term) starts on **Monday 16 January 2017** – ends on **Friday 7 April 2017**.
