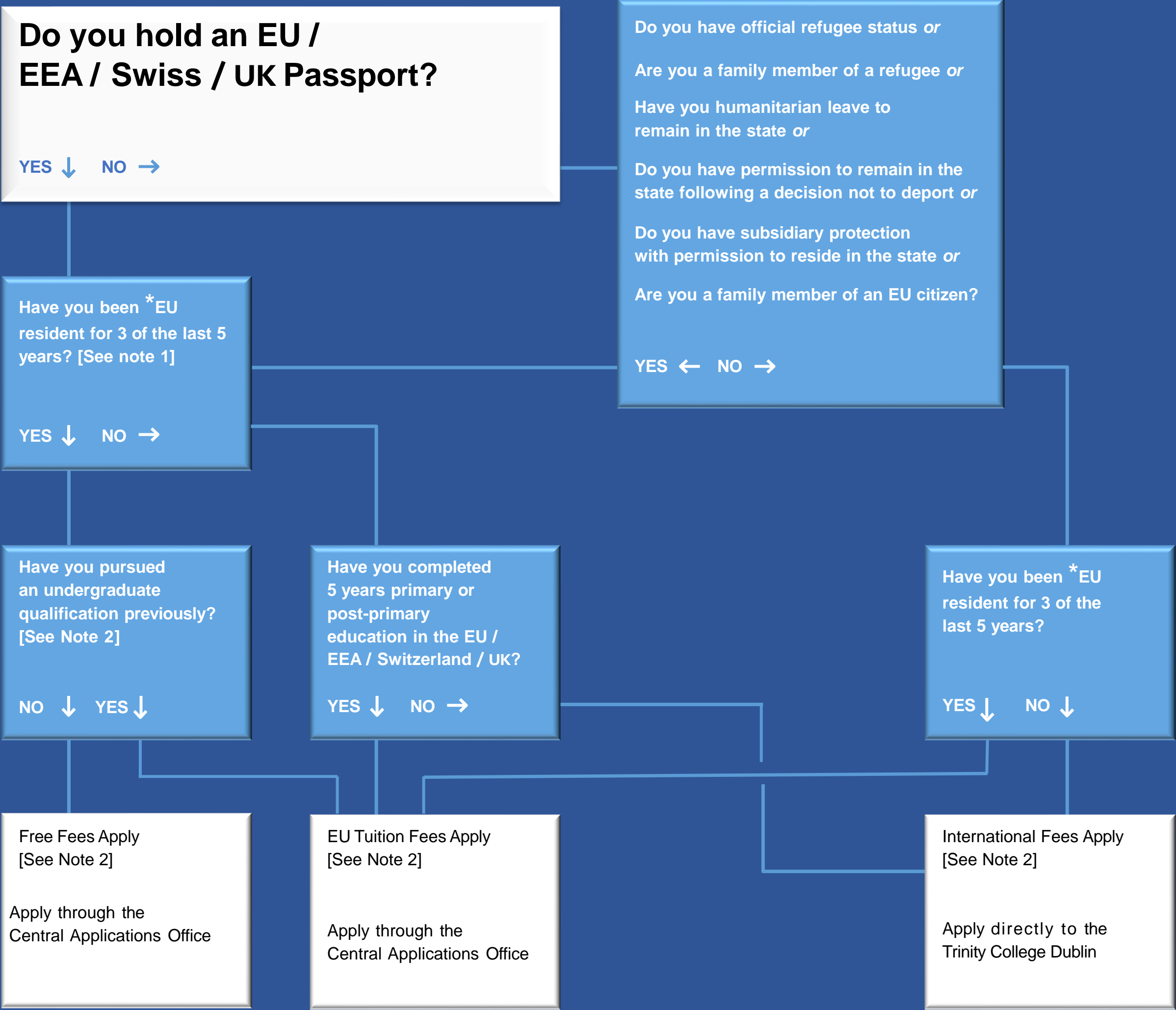

**Note 1** – Minor and dependent adult children who are in full time post primary education or the spouse/civil partner of Irish State Officials and comparable EU/EEA/Swiss/UK officials who reside with that state official while posted outside the EU/EEA/Switzerland/UK on diplomatic or consular missions shall have such time deemed as being time spent residing in the EU/EEA/Switzerland/UK when determining whether or not the residency requirements of the Free Fees Initiative have been met.

\* EU resident is a person who is ordinarily a resident<sup>1</sup> in the EU<sup>2</sup>

AND

- ❖who has received full-time post primary education **AND/OR**
- ❖who has worked full-time<sup>3</sup> in the EU for three of the five years immediately preceding admission to Trinity

OR

2. who has

- ❖official refugee status<sup>4</sup> or has been granted humanitarian leave to remain in the State **AND**
- ❖who has been ordinarily resident in the EU<sup>2</sup> for three of the five years immediately preceding admission to Trinity.

**Note 2** - Students offered a place at Trinity College Dublin may subsequently be asked

to provide additional documentation to verify their eligibility for EU Fee status. The documentary evidence to be provided could include the following:

- ❖ Passport.
- ❖ GNIB card.
- ❖ Tax documentation demonstrating residency in the EU/EEA/Switzerland/UK for 3 of the 5 years preceding admission.
- ❖ A letter from the Minister of Justice and Law Reform confirming refugee status, humanitarian leave to remain in the state, or similar permissions to remain in the state.
- ❖ Evidence of school attendance.
