Dear Friends,

My name is Mia O'Connor. As a Trinity Access student, I am so happy to have started my first year studying Medicine. I would love to tell you why Trinity Access is so important to me and so many other Trinity students. Especially now, as we face additional worry and uncertainty due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I will also explain how you can help at this time of crisis.

Trinity Access works throughout Ireland, encouraging and supporting students from under-represented groups to go to university. The Trinity Access Foundation Course prepares students, personally and academically, to go

on and study at degree level, so we can break the cycle of educational disadvantage. Trinity Access provides scholarships from €1,000 to €2,500 to Access students, to help pay for the equipment, services and facilities we need to complete our studies. This is made possible by the generosity of Trinity alumni and friends, like you. Alumni support is essential to Access students and to our education, now, more than ever.

The global health crisis has exacerbated systemic inequalities and created many new obstacles for all Trinity students. We must adapt quickly to online lectures, strict social distancing and constantly changing guidelines and timetables. It can be scary, stressful and not at all how I imagined my Trinity experience. I am so grateful to know that I have support from Trinity Access.

Until I got my place in Trinity, no one in my family had ever gone to university. It is not

the norm where I grew up, in the flats in North inner-city Dublin. I live with my mother and my 11-year-old sister, who is autistic. We are a single parent family, in a disadvantaged area, but we are lucky to be part of a tight-knit community.

My mother is a taxi driver and works hard to support me and my sister. Most people I know work as hairdressers, plumbers or in other trades, or they drive taxis, like my Mam. The career options can seem quite limited. I always dreamed of being a doctor or nurse. I love helping people and my favourite subject in school was biology.

Dreams and potential are not limited by a Postcode. Access to opportunities should not be either. I am writing to you today because Trinity Access students need your help...
