
What is Traffic Medicine?



- External review and suggestions by an international expert in the field.






















- Inclusion of guidance on the processes for rehabilitation of return to driving, as well as advice on how to manage the challenges for clinicians of advising driving cessation.

- Updated advice on cardiac catheter ablation.
- Clarification of Insulin-Treated Diabetes for Group 1 and Group 2 drivers related to Interstitial glucose monitoring systems.







- Clarification of Developmental Disorders for Group 1 drivers.
- Clarification of diagnostic criteria for Alcohol Misuse and Alcohol Dependence.
- Inclusion of guidance for Blepharospasm
- Clarification of Night Blindness for Group 1 and Group 2 drivers.
- Updated guidance for Cough Syncope
- Clarification for monitoring of treatment efficacy in Obstructive Sleep Apnoea Syndrome in Group 1 drivers.
