



Guide for Applicants

International Byzantine Greek Summer School

Online through Trinity College Dublin, July–August 2021

The Department of Classics at Trinity College Dublin is delighted to welcome back the International Byzantine Greek Summer School (IBGSS). This well-established course, directed by Dr Anthony Hirst, has been running at Trinity since 2016, after many years of success in Belfast (2002-11) and Birmingham (2012-15). The course teaches late antique and medieval Greek at Beginners, Intermediate and Advanced level and allows early learners to engage with original texts from the start (www.tcd.ie/classics/byzantine/). All levels are taught through English and a good working knowledge of English is essential for a successful learning experience.

Course details:

Level 1 12–23 July 2021	Levels 2, 2.5 and 3 26 July – 6 August 2021
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Level 1 Beginners

The Level 1 course is for absolute beginners in Byzantine Greek. It starts with the Greek alphabet and takes students through the basic grammar of Greek to the point where they can begin to translate simple Greek texts with the aid of a dictionary.

Levels 2 and 2.5

Levels 2 and 2.5 complete the coverage of basic Greek grammar and introduce students to a variety of Greek texts. Each year a number of Level 1 students continue to Level 2 (Intermediate). Level 2.5 (Higher Intermediate) covers the same ground more rapidly with additional texts.

Level 3 Advanced Reading

Level 3 is for those who have a thorough grasp of Greek grammar and who wish to sharpen their reading skills on a variety of texts (partly chosen by them) with no limit on the difficulty.

Fees

The course fee for two weeks (Level 1 or Level 2/2.5 or Level 3) is €350.

The course fee for all four weeks (Level 1 + Level 2) is €700.

Applications

1. To apply to the course, please download and complete the Application Form available at www.tcd.ie/classics/byzantine/ and return it as an email attachment to Mr Seán McCrum, smccrum.1949@gmail.com, by **30 April 2021**. Late applications may be considered if places are still available.
2. If your course application is accepted, you will receive a message that we have reserved a place for you. In **May 2021**, we will ask you to confirm your participation by paying a €100 **deposit** through the online portal of Trinity College Dublin's School of Histories and Humanities. This deposit is non-refundable.
3. You will receive a message confirming your deposit payment, your place on the course, and the balance of your tuition fee. The balance for two weeks (Level 1 or 2/2.5 or 3) is €250. The balance for four weeks (Levels 1 + 2) is €600. Please make an online payment of the balance through the online portal of Trinity College Dublin's School of Histories and Humanities before the start of the course.
4. If you require a bursary for this Summer School, please contact the Course Director, Dr Anthony Hirst, at anthony.hirst@btinternet.com. Bursaries can only provide partial assistance for fees. If you wish to be considered for funding, you must submit your application by the deadline of 30 April 2021.

Time zones and teaching hours

1. On the basis of current interest in the course, we expect to be able to accommodate students in a wide range of time zones.
2. On the application form you will be asked to specify in which time zone you will participate in this course. We will use this information to schedule teaching in such a way that it is possible for all students in each course group to participate in classes and tutorials.
3. We aim to schedule live teaching events between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. local time for all students. In some cases, the schedule may involve an 8 a.m. start or 9 p.m./10 p.m. finish, local time.
4. Students with particular restrictions due to family or work commitments should communicate these to Mr Seán McCrum (smccrum1949@gmail.com). We will do our best to consider the needs of individual students in scheduling teaching hours.
5. Students will only be asked to pay their deposit after schedules have been confirmed.

Bursaries

1. If you have indicated on the application form that you are unable to enrol in the Summer School without financial support, please contact the Course Director, Dr Anthony Hirst, at anthony.hirst@btinternet.com to request a funding application form and send him your funding application no later than **30 April 2021**.
2. Because our funding for bursaries is limited, it is important that you apply for funding only if your participation is absolutely dependent on it, and that you apply only for the amount that you really need.



3. If you are a university student or a member of academic staff, you will be asked to show that you have investigated the possibility of obtaining funding from your own university before we can confirm the award of a bursary.
4. In awarding bursaries, priority will be given to applicants to Level 1, and then Level 2/2-5. It is unlikely that bursaries will be available to Level 3 applicants.
5. We cannot provide bursary funding for the course deposit of €100.
6. If you intend to participate in Level 1 *and* Level 2, it is unlikely that we will be in a position to award you funding for Level 2.
