

**Psephophoria, Honours and Naturalisation around the Aegean:  
A Case of Athenian Institutional Influence?**  
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**1) Psephophoria and quorum in Athens**

In Athens secret ballot was used in the fourth century BCE in two circumstances:

- to ratify, with a *quorum* of 6000, naturalisation decrees enacted by *cheirotonia* in the previous Assembly meeting (see Osborne 1981-3) – the standard formula is **τοὺς δὲ πρυτάνεις δοῦναι περὶ αὐτοῦ τὴν ψῆφον τῶι δήμῳ εἰς τὴν πρώτην ἐκκλησίαν** (e.g. *IG II<sup>3</sup>* 1 452, lines 24-25).

[Dem.] 59.89-90:

πρῶτον μὲν γὰρ νόμος ἔστι τῷ δήμῳ κείμενος μὴ ἔξεῖναι ποιήσασθαι Ἀθηναῖον, ὃν ἂν μὴ δι’ ἀνδραγαθίαν εἰς τὸν δῆμον τὸν Ἀθηναίων ἄξιον ἢ γενέσθαι πολίτην. ἔπειτ’ ἐπειδὴν πεισθῇ ὁ δῆμος καὶ δῶ τὴν δωρεάν, οὐκ ἐᾶ κυρίαν γενέσθαι τὴν ποίησιν, ἐὰν μὴ τῇ ψήφῳ εἰς τὴν ἐπιοῦσαν ἐκκλησίαν ὑπερεξακισχίλιοι Ἀθηναίων ψηφίσωνται κρύβδην ψηφιζόμενοι. τοὺς δὲ πρυτάνεις κελεύει τιθέναι τοὺς καδίσκους ὁ νόμος καὶ τὴν ψῆφον διδόναι προσιόντι τῷ δήμῳ πρὶν τοὺς ξένους εἰσιέναι, καὶ τὰ γέρρα ἀνατρεῖν, ἵνα κύριος ὁν αὐτὸς αὐτοῦ ἔκαστος σκοπῆται πρὸς αὐτὸν ὅντινα μέλλει πολίτην ποιήσεσθαι, εἰ ἄξιός ἔστι τῇ δωρεᾷς ὁ μέλλων λήψεσθαι.

First, there is an established law that prohibits the Assembly (*demos*) from making anyone an Athenian citizen who is not worthy of it by virtue of his upright action on the city's behalf. Second, when the city is persuaded to give this gift, it does not make the decree valid until, at the next meeting of the Assembly, it is approved by a secret vote of more than six thousand citizens. The law requires the *Prytaneis* to place the ballot urns out for the Assembly before foreigners enter, and the barriers are lifted to make sure that each Assembly member thinks over entirely by himself whether the man up for citizenship is worthy to receive this gift.

- to grant *adeia* to discuss matters otherwise forbidden, e.g. to allow, again with a quorum of 6000, matters concerning *atimoi* and state-debtors to be discussed and decisions about them to be made in the Assembly (see Esu 2021).

Dem. 24.45 (reliable document, see Canevaro 2013: 127-32):

ΝΟΜΟΣ ... μηδὲ περὶ τῶν ἀτίμων, ὅπως χρὴ ἐπιτίμους αὐτοὺς εἶναι, μηδὲ περὶ τῶν ὄφειλόντων τοῖς θεοῖς ἢ τῷ δημοσίᾳ τῷ Ἀθηναίων περὶ ἀφέσεως τοῦ ὄφλήματος ἢ τάξεως, ἐὰν μὴ ψηφισαμένων Ἀθηναίων τὴν ἄδειαν πρῶτον μὴ ἔλαττον ἔξακισχιλίων, οἵς ἂν δόξῃ κρύβδην ψηφιζομένοις. τότε δ’ ἔξεῖναι χρηματίζειν καθ’ ὅ τι ἂν τῇ βουλῇ καὶ τῷ δήμῳ δοκῇ.

LAW . . . neither about disenfranchised citizens, that they need to be re-enfranchised, nor about debtors to the gods or to the public treasury of the Athenians, on the remission or composition of the debt, if permission is not granted by no less than 6,000 Athenians, who so resolve voting by secret ballot. Then it shall be permitted to deliberate according to what the Council and the Assembly have resolved.

(The documents inserted in Dem. 24.59 and Andoc. 1.87, prescribing a quorum and *psephophoria* in the case of *nomoi ep'andri*, are later forgeries and should not be considered reliable evidence for Athenian procedure, see Canevaro-Harris 2012: 117-119; Canevaro 2013: 145-50; Canevaro 2019.)

**2) Naturalisation and *psephophoria* in Samos (*IG XII*, 4 1 131, lines 12-17)**
