<b>Module Content</b>	<p>This module will expand on the concepts and skills acquired in CLU11203 Reading Ancient Literature, considering how the techniques of literary analysis may be deployed in the discursive format of the essay. Working together in groups, students will build towards the production of an assignment on an author of their choice: lectures/practical sessions will consider such topics as bibliography and referencing, evidence and argumentation, structure and organisation of the essay. Students will have the opportunity to revise their work on the basis of peer feedback.</p>
