Module Content	<p>In this ancient Greek module, you will study a variety of texts that will enable you to acquire a substantial vocabulary, consolidate your understanding of grammar (phonology, morphology, syntax and pragmatics), and develop an appreciation of how Greek was used in different contexts over the centuries. You will encounter some of the many different ways in which ancient literary texts may be 'read', analysed, interpreted and translated, and explore the features of literary and non-literary texts in different genres and styles.</p>
