Module Content	This module will provide you with the foundations of the ancient Greek language, with emphasis on the Classical Attic dialect, and will prepare you for reading original, un-adapted Greek texts in Elementary Greek II and intermediate modules. You will learn fundamental aspects of the grammar of Attic Greek (phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics) and start reading adapted texts that will enable you to acquire a basic vocabulary. You will start to consider approaches to analysis and translation, and receive a taste of how Greek was used in different literary and non-literary contexts and genres.
