Topics will include political systems such as oligarchy and democracy, Greek historiography under Herodotus and Thucydides, Athenian and Spartan imperialism, Sicily and South Italy, Panhellenism, and the rise of Macedon.  The Project element of this module requires a substantial amount of independent research on a text/topic to be agreed with the module coordinator.
