Module Content	<p>In this module students will be introduced to either a single-author text or a selection of texts from one or more different genres, including but not limited to poetry, comedy, philosophy, historiography, etc. Each class will focus on a different section of text or theme and will consist of a mix of translation, textual analysis, and discussion. Students will apply their experience in Greek grammar to close reading and analysis of ancient Greek texts.</p>
