LOCATION	Dublin, Ireland
HOST UNIVERSITY	Trinity College Dublin
DISCIPLINES	Open to all subject areas. <i>Note: Students can mix and match across all disciplines, but must indicate areas of interest in application for admission.</i>
TERMS AVAILABLE	Autumn Semester (Michaelmas Term): Late August to Mid-December Spring Semester (Hilary Term): Mid-January to Early May Academic Year: Late August to Early May
LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION	English. <i>Note: Popular Irish Language and Literature course available at entry level, free non-credit Irish Language course available, and Advanced Irish Language classes offered.</i>
ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS	Students must be in good academic standing and have a minimum of 3.3 GPA or higher.
HOW TO APPLY	Apply to TCD by 15 October for Spring and 15 April for Autumn and Academic Year at TCD link below and your home institution for approval. If not from a CASA member institution, apply via Brown University.
LOCATION	Trinity College Dublin's campus sits at the very centre of Dublin's historic and modern city centre. Dublin is Ireland's vibrant capital city, and offers all of the rich heritage, history and culture that Ireland has to offer, while also being a young, cosmopolitan city with a thriving social scene. Dublin is a UNESCO City of Literature, the site of EU headquarters of many multinational companies, regularly voted a safe and fun study abroad destination, and located between the mountains and the sea, there is always something to do or explore! It's also easy, quick and cheap travel to the rest of Europe and the UK.
HOST INSTITUTION	Founded in 1592, Trinity College Dublin is Ireland's oldest university, and recognised internationally for its academic excellence, research-led curriculum and transformative student experience. Trinity's alumni include Nobel Prize Winners, Former Presidents of Ireland, global thought leaders and trailblazers in many disciplines.
ACADEMICS	Trinity is Ireland's highest ranking university and is a centre of teaching and research excellence. Students can enrol in classes, known as modules, throughout Trinity's three faculties: Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences; Engineering Maths and Sciences; and Health Sciences. Students specify their areas of desired study at Trinity in their application for admission in order to take classes in them on arrival.
