## PROGRAMME FEATURES

<b>DATES</b>	Early June – Early August
<b>ELIGIBILITY</b>	Open to students from CASA member schools and non-member schools by permission.
<b>REQUIREMENTS</b>	Students must be in good academic standing and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. There are no pre-requisites and the programme welcomes students from any area of study.
<b>APPLICATION DEADLINE</b>	20 February 2019 See links below for application information.
<b>COURSE</b>	Students take a course titled Contemporary Global Politics that is team-taught by Trinity College Dublin faculty members and is worth 10 ECTS (4 US credit hours). Students participate in academic lectures, seminars and in-class simulations. Students from any area of study are welcome to apply.
<b>INTERNSHIPS</b>	Students participate in a 6-week Dublin internship coordinated by EUSA. A wide variety of internships are available in well-known companies in many industry sectors, as well as with smaller, innovative organisations. They are intellectually engaging opportunities based on the student's field of interest, professional goals and skillset, and do not have to be related to the course content.
<b>STUDENT LIFE</b>	Students are provided with an Orientation Programme delivered by the Programme Director, as well as events throughout the summer, and excursions, including: a tour of the Irish Senate, tour of Dublin Castle, Marsh's Library, the Little Museum of Dublin, a day trip outside of Dublin City to the World Heritage Site Newgrange, and more! Students are also encouraged to explore Dublin and Ireland, and get involved in life in Dublin - from hikes along Dublin's beautiful coast, to boat rides around Dublin Bay, easy train and bus travel from Dublin to the rest of Ireland, summer music festivals and gigs, outdoor movies and yoga, there is always something new to explore. 24/7 health and safety support is offered by EUSA and advising is offered by the Programme Director.
<b>HOUSING</b>	Students live in apartments at Trinity Hall, an official residence of Trinity College Dublin located in the Dublin suburb of Dartry. Located a 15 minute bus ride or light rail ride away from Trinity (or a 45 minute walk), the dorms are in a safe and beautiful area of the city. The fully furnished rooms consist of a bed, wardrobe, desk, shared bathroom, kitchen, living area, and internet connection. Students cook for themselves at their housing, and have access to all the good eats Dublin has to offer. Gym access is available at an extra cost on Trinity College Dublin's main campus where you will be taking classes.
<b>LOCATION</b>	For centuries, Ireland, the gateway to Europe, has been renowned for its rich heritage in music, literature and art. Nestled between the mountains and the sea, Dublin has a young and cosmopolitan population of about 1.5 million people who are known for being friendly, open, and welcoming. A UNESCO City of Literature, the city bustles with energy and a thriving social scene. Blending a high-energy, multinational professional culture with traditional Irish warmth and hospitality, Dublin has sprawling parks, cosy cafés and quirky restaurants for the daytime, with classic pubs, fashionable clubs, music gigs and theatre by night. With the EU Headquarters of a large number of companies, from Google to Facebook, LinkedIn, Microsoft and more based in Dublin city, Dublin is not just a vibrant capital city - it is an international centre of excellence for business, culture and the arts.
