
Dementia affects over 46.8 million individuals globally—the number of people affected is expected to double every 20 years, reaching 131.5 million in 2050

The Irish Longitudinal Study on Ageing (TILDA) is a large-scale, nationally representative, longitudinal study on ageing in Ireland

Over 8,500 people took part in the first wave of TILDA in 2009 and 2010. Commenced Wave 2 of the study in 2012

Advancing Proactive Digital Integrated Care

ProACT (Integrated Technology Ecosystem for ProACTIVE Patient Centred Care) will address a major EU research priority in personalised healthcare to develop advanced ICT systems and services for Integrated Care.

ProACT will target Europe's 50 million multi-morbid patients to proactively self-manage and offset the EU's annual €700 billion cost of chronic disease management
