### **Embedding Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in Your Teaching**

#### Why ESD?

UNESCO recognises ESD as essential to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). ESD empowers learners to make informed, responsible choices for a sustainable future. Trinity's ESD Curriculum Design Framework adapts this vision to support staff in embedding ESD into modules and programmes.

### The Trinity ESD Curriculum Design Framework

This framework has **four key elements**:

- 1. **ESD Themes** based on the SDG "wedding cake" (biosphere, society, economy), with partnerships cutting across all layers.
- 2. **ESD Competencies** the skills, values, and attitudes students need to contribute to sustainability.
- 3. **Pedagogical Approaches** learner-centred, action-oriented, and transformative.
- 4. **Teaching, Learning, and Assessment (TLA) Strategies** practical methods to put the approaches into action.

#### Three Steps to Embed ESD

## Step 1 – Identify Relevant SDGs & Themes

- Review your module/programme and note where SDGs or ESD themes naturally appear.
- If none are obvious, consider how topics could connect to sustainability issues.

# **Step 2 – Develop ESD Competencies**

- Check which competencies your current learning outcomes already address.
- If needed, reframe outcomes so students develop sustainability skills such as critical thinking, systems analysis, or collaboration.

### Step 3 – Align Teaching, Learning & Assessment (TLA)

- Use strategies that match UNESCO's pedagogical approaches:
  - Learner-centred: group discussions, peer learning
  - Action-oriented: real-world projects, problem-solving
  - Transformative: reflective activities, visioning exercises
- Align assessments so they reinforce these approaches.
