**A meeting of the University Council was held on Wednesday 12 October 2005 at 11.15 am in the Board Room.**

**SECTION A**

- CL/05-06/001 Statutory Declaration** New members attending for the first time made the statutory declaration.
- CL/05-06/002 Minutes** The Minutes of the meeting of 29 June 2005 were approved and signed.
- CL/05-06/003 Matters Arising from the Minutes** A number of matters arising from the Minutes were discussed and have been minuted under appropriate headings hereafter.
- CL/05-06/004 Agenda** The College Secretary stated that he had received a request to bring forward to Section A the document from Students' Union officers on student representation on Executive Committees which had been included in the supplementary circulation as a Section C item.
- CL/05-06/005 Joint Degrees – Registrar's Working Party on Joint Degrees (see Actum CL/04-05/182 of 29 June 2005)** In response to a question from the Vice-President of the Graduate Students' Union, the Registrar indicated that he will be bringing forward later in the Michaelmas Term details of a statutory amendment to facilitate the award of joint degrees, together with a draft protocol for the processing of all joint degree proposals.
- CL/05-06/006 Graduate Schools – Discussion Paper (see Actum CL/04-05/183 of 29 June 2005)** In response to a question from the Vice-President of the Graduate Students' Union, the

Dean of Graduate Studies advised Council that the discussion paper on Graduate Schools had been circulated to and discussed briefly by the Heads' Committee. It will also be circulated for discussion at the first meeting of the newly constituted Graduate Studies Committee.

**CL/05-06/007 Centre for Language and Communication Studies – Broad Curriculum Foreign Language Modules (see Actum CL/04-05/181 of 29<sup>th</sup> June 2005)** In response to a question from the Education Officer of the Students' Union, the Senior Lecturer advised that the former Senior Lecturer had met with the Director of the Centre for Language and Communication Studies to discuss the issues raised at the previous meeting. As advised on the Broad Curriculum website, language modules are available to Senior Freshmen students and where substitution is available, students may substitute either a cross-faculty course or a language module.

**CL/05-06/008 Academic Structures – Relationship between new Schools, Faculties and Central Decision-making (see Actum CL/04-05/183 (ii) (a) of 29 June 2005)** In response to a question from the Education Officer of the Students' Union, the Senior Lecturer confirmed the position regarding student representation at the Heads' Committee as set out in the minute, i.e. that student representatives may attend the Heads' Committee to present papers relating to specific items, as was previously the case with the Deans' Committee. The Education Officer requested circulation of documentation in advance of meetings and the Senior Lecturer undertook to consult further on this matter.

**CL/05-06/009 Academic Structures – Relationship between new Schools, Faculties and Central Decision-making (see Actum CL/04-05/183 (ii) (d) of 29 June 2005)** In response to a question from the Vice-President of the Graduate Students' Union, the College Secretary advised that although Council was operating under interim arrangements for 2005-06, its role had not changed and it continued to have the same functions and powers as it had prior to interim arrangements being put in place.

**CL/05-06/010 College Calendar (see Actum CL/04-05/185 of 29 June 2005)** The College Secretary advised that the College *Calendar* will be available for distribution within the next few weeks and he thanked all those involved in preparing it for publication.

**CL/05-06/011 Provost's Report**

(i) ***BA Festival of Science*** The Provost extended his thanks to all those who had supported the very successful BA Festival of Science, which had been hosted by the College. In particular, he extended his thanks to the Dean of Science and his team for their work in ensuring its success.

(ii) ***National Longitudinal Study of Children in Ireland*** This project had been awarded to Trinity and the Economic and Social Research Institute (ESRI), and initially will be for a seven year period. The project had been spearheaded in Trinity by the Children's Research Centre, although several areas had been involved in the initiative.

(iii) ***Trinity Access Programme – Goldman Sachs Award*** The Trinity Access Programme had received a grant from Goldman Sachs amounting to approximately €300,000 for its work with students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

- (iv) *Irish Universities Association* The Conference of Heads of Irish Universities (CHIU) had renamed itself the Irish Universities Association (IUA). The IUA is currently involved in mounting a campaign to increase funding levels to the universities including the third-level, the fourth-level and support systems. It will be important that plans are in place to respond to any invitations to bid for funding and in this context, the importance of the strategic planning process in Schools/Vice-Deaneries and at a College level was noted.
- (v) *The Sunday Times University Guide 2005* The Sunday Times University Guide 2005 had been published and for the second year running, Trinity had been identified as the top ranking university in Ireland.

**CL/05-06/012 Academic Re-Structuring**

- (i) *Directors in Schools and Vice-Deaneries* A memorandum from the Senior Lecturer dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 2005 had been circulated. Council approved the nominations for Directorship appointments in Schools and Vice-Deaneries as circulated, noting that the term of appointment is for two years, renewable for a further two, with appointment normally commencing on 13<sup>th</sup> July of the relevant year. Nominations had not yet been received from all Schools and Vice-Deaneries and the Senior Lecturer indicated that the outstanding information will be circulated for the next meeting.
- (ii) *Membership of Executive Committees in Schools and Vice-Deaneries* A memorandum from the Senior Lecturer dated 7<sup>th</sup> October 2005 had been circulated. The Senior Lecturer advised Council that Heads of School and Vice-Deans had been invited to advise him by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2005 of the membership of Executive Committees, and while the majority had provided the information, there are still a number of queries to be resolved. Detailed information will be circulated to the next meeting of Council.
- (iii) *Student Representation on School, Vice-Deanery and Faculty Committees* A memorandum from the Senior Lecturer dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 2005 had been circulated together with supporting documentation which set out the details of undergraduate and postgraduate student representation on School, Vice-Deanery and Faculty Committees. The detailed recommendations had been arrived at following initial discussion and review by the Deans' Committee, consultation with officers of the students' unions, and discussion by the Heads' Committee at its meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> September. Following a brief discussion and clarification of a number of issues, the Senior Lecturer indicated that there may be a number of minor modifications to the data presented and that these would be circulated for the next meeting.

**CL/05-06/013 Nominations for Appointment** Council noted and approved the circulated information (see Appendix 1). In response to a query from the Dean of Graduate Studies, the College Secretary undertook to clarify the basis for nominations to the post of Senior Research Fellow. Council noted the comments of the Dean of Graduate Studies that he was seeking clarification in order that the status of such staff regarding supervision of research students could be determined.

**CL/05-06/014 Appointment to Professorial Chairs** A memorandum from the College Secretary dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 2005 had been circulated. It was noted that during the current year the membership of Council has been reduced pending statutory change, resulting in a number of former members attending as observers. With regard to the filling of

Professorial Chairs, Council noted and approved the following resolution regarding the status of those currently attending as observers

*That for the academic year 2005/06, those academic staff members who would have been formerly full members of Council and who now attend as observers be regarded as full members of Council for the purpose of filling Professorial Chairs.*

**CL/05-06/015 Heads of School Committee** Draft minutes of the first meeting of the Heads of School Committee held on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2005 had been circulated. The Senior Lecturer advised Council that initially the committee had been named the Heads' Forum however the Board had agreed that it should be renamed 'Heads of School Committee'. Draft terms of reference had been considered by the committee and following discussion and further communication with the Senior Lecturer, the terms of reference will be updated and circulated for approval at the next meeting. Where a Head/Vice-Dean is unable to attend a Heads' meeting, it was agreed that limited substitution will be permitted in 2005-06 and that this will be reviewed at the end of 2005-06. The Committee had also discussed the strategic planning process, the proposed timescales, and the alignment of the process in academic units with the College's strategic planning. Heads had also noted and approved student representation in School, Vice-Deanery and Faculty Committees and in relation to student representation on Executive Committees, had advised the Senior Lecturer of the extent of support or opposition that existed. The committee had also agreed the need to discuss current arrangements for cross-discipline teaching and to develop guidelines where it was proposed that existing arrangements should be altered.

In the discussion, Council noted that the Secretary to the Scholars' Committee should be advised of any developments regarding the proposed review of the Foundation Scholarship examination.

In response to a question, the Senior Lecturer stated that it was not proposed that the Bursar should become a member of the Heads' Committee. As already agreed, the Bursar will be invited to attend meetings for discussion of financial matters and in relation to the implementation of the Academically-based Resource Allocation Model (ARAM). Implications of the phased implementation of ARAM had yet to be considered in detail.

With regard to service teaching, the Senior Lecturer indicated that the detailed aspects of arrangements for service teaching and their implications had yet to be considered. He acknowledged the point made by the Dean of Engineering and Systems Sciences that the quality of the service provided should be included as a dimension when existing arrangements for cross-discipline teaching are being reviewed.

Responding to a comment regarding the use of the words 'reform agenda' in the Heads' Committee minutes, the Senior Lecturer stated that in his view these words appropriately described the changes that had taken place in College over the past year. He commented that as the College proceeded with its reform agenda, it will be important to ensure that the quality of our programmes is maintained.

The Senior Lecturer undertook to ensure that appropriate linkages were put in place to allow adequate interaction between the Undergraduate Teaching and Learning Committee and the Centre for Academic Practice and Student Learning (CAPSL).

*Student Representatives on Executive Committees* With regard to student representatives on Executive Committees, it was noted that this matter is currently under discussion by the Board. The Senior Lecturer had been asked to meet with the relevant parties and to bring a resolution to the next Board meeting. The Senior

Lecturer stated that he had had several meetings with the relevant parties and a further meeting is currently being scheduled. As this process had yet to be completed, it was proposed that Council should not engage in a separate detailed discussion. It was noted that the very detailed document from the officers of the students' unions would form part of the basis for discussion with the relevant parties.

The Provost invited the student representatives to outline briefly the issues raised in their circulated paper. The Education Officer stated that the document rehearsed the background and history of student representation in College and argued the case for student representation at a broad level in the College, as well as the specific case of student representation on Executive Committees.

The Dean of Engineering and Systems Sciences stated that in his view, there was some misunderstanding regarding this issue and that it was complicated by the use of different nomenclature in different areas.

Council noted that the Senior Lecturer will advise Board at its next meeting of the outcome of his discussions.
