# **SECTION A.1: Policy Matters**

The Provost welcomed everyone to Council and requested that Council members declare any potential conflicts of interest relating to the agenda. The Secretary to the College/Director of Governance advised Council there were no statement of interest declared. Council noted that Seathrún Sardina has resigned from Council - he has successfully passed his PhD viva and is returning to the US. Provost welcomed the new Chief Operating Officer Noel Gorman and congratulated Students' Union members elected to the Union of Students of Ireland.

# CL/24-25/138 Strategic Plan 2025 – 2030 Update

The Provost presented an update on the Strategic Plan 2025-2030 to Council. She explained how the updated HEA legislation impacted the development process and briefly outlined the stakeholder engagement process and progress to date. The Provost emphasised that the Strategic Plan is about clearly articulating the priorities and direction for the next five years, rather than being a checklist of everything we do. The Provost discussed the three overarching themes of the plan—purpose, people, and place—and outlined six draft commitments around research and innovation, teaching and learning, student wellbeing and belonging, thriving workplace for staff, and infrastructure - physical and digital. She also highlighted our values and existing strategies as key enablers for the new plan and updated Council on funding principles for this plan. The Provost concluded by advising that Board had reviewed and discussed the first

draft of the Strategic Plan at their March meeting. A Board Working Group continues its work with the aim of obtaining full approval by June, submitting to the HEA by July, and formally launching later this year.

Council noted the importance of the University leading the commitment to core values in the sector and wider society.

# CL/24-25/139 Trends in HEAR (Higher Education Access Route) and DARE (Disability Access Route) Schemes

The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer gave a presentation to Council on trends in HEAR (Higher Education Access Route) and DARE (Disability Access Route) Schemes in Trinity. The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer extended her thanks to the colleagues who collated this report and gave a brief context why these trends are being reviewed in Trinity and the wider sector. Data presented is for the period 2018-2024.

The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer highlighted to Council that:

- There is an emerging pattern HEAR access numbers slowly but consistently going down and DARE access numbers are consistently going up.
- Many students with Disability needs do not come to Trinity via DARE scheme.
  Conversely, high numbers of student that come via DARE don't register with DisAbility Services. This makes it complex for Student Services, and for the Schools to plan the supports students require.

Council had a robust discussion and noted that communication on schemes could be strengthened: at sectoral level and by Trinity in terms of making HEAR scheme for higher education more well known, and at Trinity in terms of encouraging students registering for DisAbility services. Council also noted the need to lobby at sectoral level for aligning DARE scheme and HEA criteria used for SLD, where criteria mismatch result in funding gaps.

# CL/24-25/140 Embedding Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in New Undergraduate Course Proposals

The Senior Lecturer and Dean of Undergraduate Studies provided a brief overview of the update to the process for new undergraduate course proposals which encourage integration of Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) into the undergraduate curriculum. He presented a proposal that all new undergraduate course proposal(s) would incorporate ESD module goal(s), where feasible/appropriate, by including at least one programme-level learning outcome related to ESD themes and/or competencies. If a proposed degree programme does not have (at least) one sustainability programme goal, it must provide (and have approved) a clear reasoning for such non-inclusion. This is proposed as one of the approaches to embedding ESD within the curriculum.

# CL/24-25/141 Academic Year Structure: Update to Trinity week 26/27

The Senior Lecturer and Dean of Undergraduate Studies presented a memorandum outlining the need to move Trinity Week in 2026/27 from the week commencing 19<sup>th</sup> April to the week commencing 26<sup>th</sup> April 2027. This modification is needed to ensure that Trinity Week falls within Trinity Term, in accordance with the College Statutes.

# CL/24-25/142 Vice-Provost/ Chief Academic Officer's Report

The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer reported to Council on:

- Senior Academic Promotion review process progress and timelines. The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer updated Council on progress so far and advised that Schools continue to work on identifying discipline norms and metrics to inform the review. This step requires a bit more time, and notwithstanding, it is expected that a revised process and procedure will be brought to completion in Autumn 2025.
- Meeting with DFHERIS on behalf of CAO. The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer updated Council that Leaving Certificate results will be published 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2025, this includes post marking modification. 2025 Leaving Certificate will see the first reduction of mark inflation implemented, which will likely present challenges for students and Higher Education Institutions alike. The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer also reported that DFHERIS have an appetite to develop to a single application portal for Higher Education, Further Education and Apprenticeship schemes.
- HCI celebration event will take place on May 30<sup>th</sup> where colleagues who participated in HCI funded projects will connect, share collaborations, success stories and lessons learnt.

The Vice-Provost / Chief Academic Officer's report was followed by brief discussion by Council on reasons students might reapply via CAO for courses.

# CL/24-25/143 Provost's Report

The Provost reported to Council on the University of Sanctuary initiative, which, after several months of work by Trinity Global and with the support of the Department of Foreign Affairs, enabled Trinity to welcome 12 individuals from Gaza—2 undergraduate students, 8 postgraduate students, and 2 researchers.
