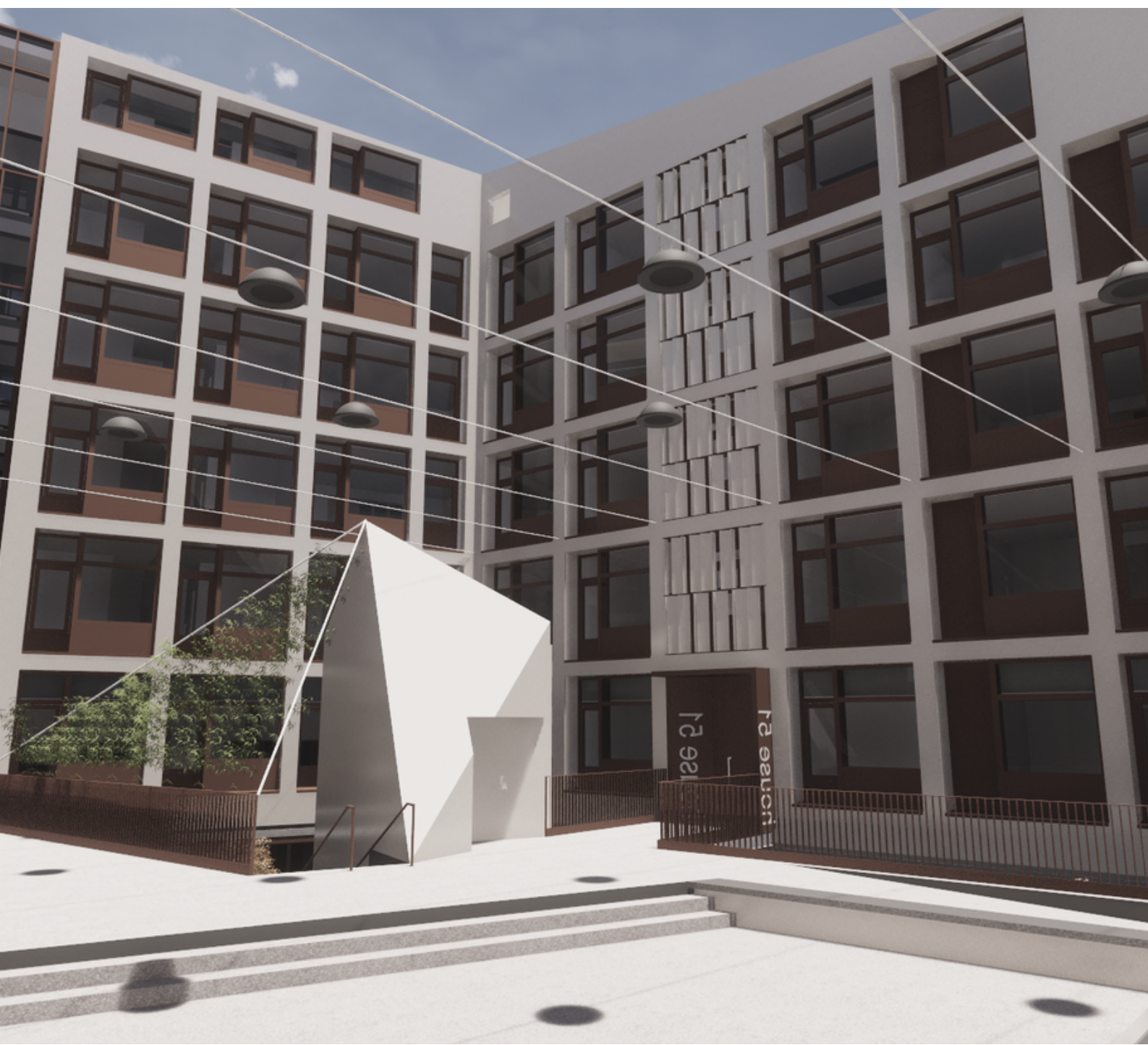

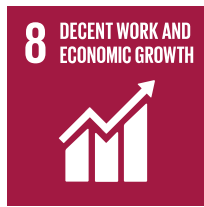
Sustainability Charter

Close to one billion people, 15% of the global population, live with some form of disability. Thus, It is now critical to address these far-reaching global disabilities proactively together. The 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are committed to **"Leave No One Behind"** regardless of social identity.

Trinity College Dublin is committed to being a global leader in university sustainability. The Trinity Disability Service is fully committed to being leaders in sustainability and its intersectionality with disability.

UN Sustainability Goals and Disability

The SDGs consist of 17 goals ([Link opens in a new window](#)) with 169 targets identified to achieve them. The SDGs are based on a three-pronged approach to sustainable development: Economic growth, social inclusion, and environmental protection. Five of the SDGs identify disabled people as key agents:

- **Goal 4 - Quality Education:** Guaranteeing equal and accessible education by building inclusive learning environments and providing the needed assistance for disabled people.
- **Goal 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth:** Promoting inclusive economic growth, full and productive employment, and allowing disabled people to fully access the job market.
- **Goal 10 - Reduced Inequalities:** Emphasizing the social, economic, and political inclusion of disabled people.
- **Goal 11 - Sustainable Cities and Communities:** Creating accessible cities and water resources, affordable, accessible, and sustainable transport systems, providing universal access to safe, inclusive, accessible, and green public spaces.
- **Goal 17 - Partnerships for the Goals:** Underlining the importance of data collection and monitoring of the SDGs, emphasis on disability disaggregated data.

Trinity's Sustainability plan is the college's roadmap for building and operating a healthier, more sustainable campus community for everyone.

Our Sustainable Vision

The UN Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face, including disabled poverty, disabled inequality, climate change, environmental degradation, peace, and justice.

All lights are LED. Our space motion sensors are installed and we will make sure to switch off lights when leaving a room and use natural light as often as possible as an alternative.



Open Plan

To maximise the usability and efficiency of our space we will have bookable meeting rooms available to both students, staff and disabled graduates.



Good Ergonomics

All rooms will be equipped with state-of-the-art inclusive designs catering to differing needs. This will allow us to show by example what is possible in all of the types of office or study settings our customers will be working within.



Reuse & Recycle

Reuse and recycle or donate office E-Waste and equipment.



Cleaning

We will use Non-Toxic Cleaning Products.



Video Calls

We will replace unnecessary business trips with video calls.



Carbon Footprint

We will learn and reduce carbon emissions by exploring carbon credit.



Green Plants

Staff will be given a plant to nourish and will be installed in all office spaces.



Green Procurement

We will ensure all purchases are environmentally sustainable.



Green Commute

Staff will be encouraged to cycle or walk to work if at all possible or to use public transport. Showering facilities will be available in Printing House Square for staff who green commute.
