

What is a biobank?

A biobank is a collection of tissue, blood or other bodily fluids and healthcare data (information in patients' hospital chart such as details about their condition, test results, images/scans) provided by patients for health research. Biobanks are used by researchers to learn about different diseases, develop better diagnostic tests and treatments that will improve the quality of life of people living with a disease. All research studies need approval to ensure they are carried out ethically and safely, that patient rights are protected, and the study complies with data protection regulations.




