Module Outline:

This course will look at two schools of thought the No-Self and Self theorists from a historical perspective. It will look at the writings of Locke, Hume, Kant, Sartre and Husserl, to explore the question whether we can coherently appeal to a self.

Learning Outcomes:

On successful completion of this module, students will be able to critically address the following questions:

- Does Consciousness require a Self?
- Who or What is a self? Is it 1) an illusion 2) something substantial 3) something insubstantial?
- Is there a difference between being self-conscious and being conscious of ourselves as selves?
- Is the self a fiction?
- Should we endorse a narrative conception of the self?
- Why do we regard an appeal to a self, necessary?
- Are we always conscious of ourselves as selves?
