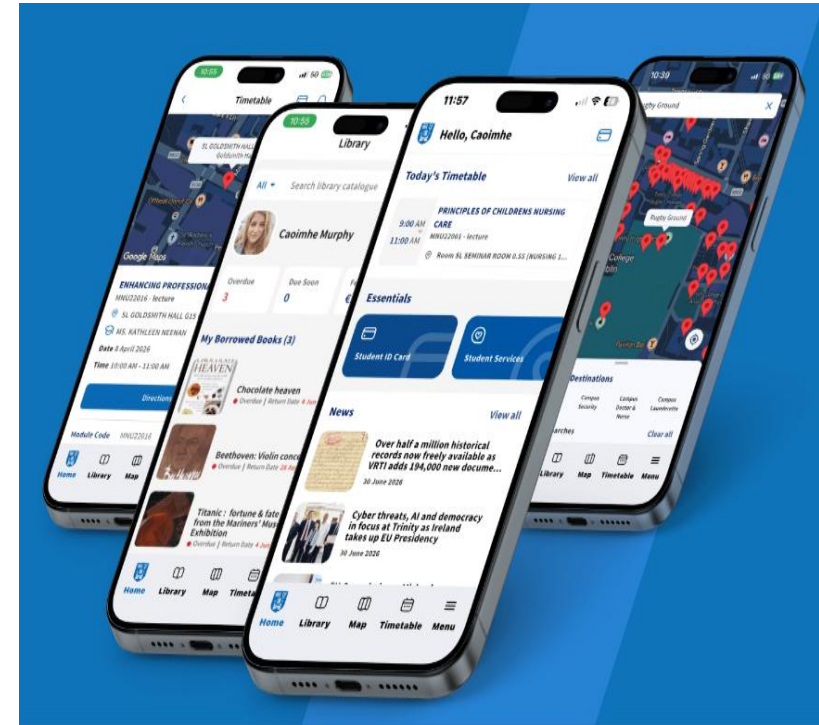

International Student Information

UK Visas

Good to know...

- Please update us if your contact details change.
- UK Visas require us to keep an attendance record. Drop by the CRR office once a week in term time to sign the attendance register.
- You can work up to 20 hours a week during term time and full-time during the holidays (study weeks & Christmas break) and after course completion.

Irish Visitor Visas

Some nationalities will need a Short Stay C Tourist visa to visit the Republic of Ireland.

As part of the application, you will need to send off your passport, so consider your travel plans.

The application is online and can take several weeks. There is a Dublin field trip on 8 April, so applying in January should work well.



Healthcare



- Your student visa entitles you to use the national health service.
- It is advisable to register at your local GP (doctor's) practice in case you need medical attention during the year.

- This is also where to find details of emergency services and private clinics.

Opening a Bank Account



- App-based banks are popular with international students. For example: Monzo, Revolut, Paypal, Starling, Wyse.
- Want to open an account at a local bank? You will need to be a registered student, have proof of an address in Northern Ireland, and a supporting letter from the CRR office.
- UK or international banks for example Nationwide, Santander, HSBC tend to offer a better experience to international students than local banks.

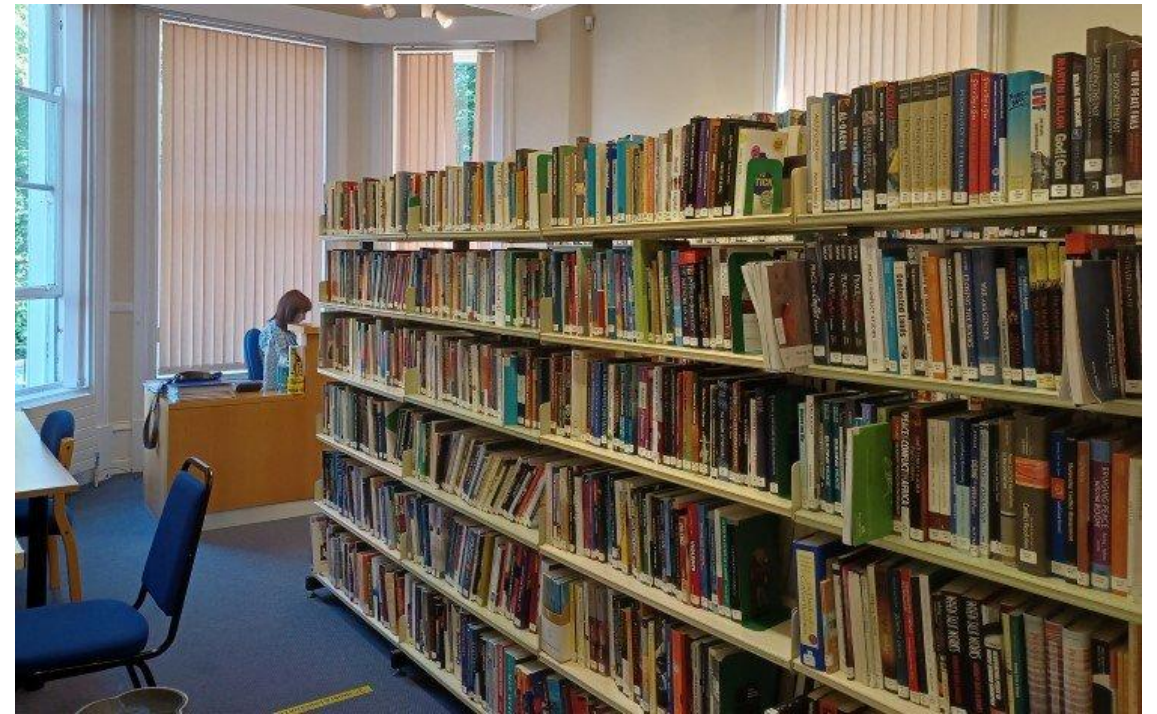
