Essential **INFORMATION**

Placements are unpaid and students are responsible for meeting all costs incurred by undertaking an internship such as insurance, accommodation, travel, etc.

Students must ensure that they meet any relevant visa requirements for taking up an internship position.

Students are required to have insurance that covers them in the workplace.

ACADEMIC CREDIT & ASSESSMENT

Internships are in-person, online, or hybrid and last approximately 12 weeks outside of the academic term. Interns typically work a maximum of 20 hours per week.

Students who opt to take the internship module for credit must submit a reflection on their experience, which will be graded on a pass/fail basis. Students who do not wish to take the module for credit will still receive assistance finding a placement.



WHO DO OUR STUDENTS INTERN WITH?

Our students have interned with NGOs such as UNICEF Ireland, World Vision, Front Line Defenders, Voice Ireland, Korean Sharing Movement and Global Action Plan amongst others.

Students are permitted to find their own internship placements. However, any internship must receive prior approval from the Course Coordinator if it is to be taken for credit. Please be aware that partner NGOs may change from year to year.
