

- Founded in 1830, The Theo, along with The Phil and The Hist, is one of the three oldest societies in Trinity and we are the oldest student-led theology society in the world!
- Every Monday evening at 6:30pm in the GMB, we host scholarly speakers from various academic institutions around Ireland and abroad. These events are followed by chats and refreshments (and sometimes a pub!), and they are a great way to meet other students and professors, especially from the school of religion.
 - Every Wednesday between 12-2pm we hold Library Lunchtimes in the Bram Stoker room in the GMB. During this time Theo members can pop in to take books out from our library and chat to other members.
 - This year we are hoping to use Library Lunchtimes as a way to keep Religion students connected. We will always have at least one 4th year religion student at the Library Lunchtimes, whose frame of reference may be helpful to you if you have any questions or need a few tips!



Student Voices!



This year we want to hear as many student voices and ideas as we can!

- GASTA CHARITY FUNDRAISING COMPETITION: On October 20th we are hosting a charity fundraising Gasta in collaboration with the Metafizz. A Gasta is a format for giving short and concise academic presentations. Any paper given can be a maximum of 5 minutes long. Once the speaker is nearing the end of their presentation, the audience starts counting backwards from 5 seconds, and the speaker must attempt to conclude their thesis in that time. Once everyone has spoken, the audience will vote for the best three presentations. (fine details being finalized).
- ANNUAL PAPER COMPETITION: This competition takes place just after Christmas, and it is a FANTASTIC way to get comfortable with longer form public speaking. Submit an academic essay no longer than 3,000 words on any topic related to the study of religion and theology. If you submit a paper, you will get to read it up on the podium in the GMB!
- CHAMBER DEBATES: On Wednesday the 12th of November we are collaborating with The Hist and The Muslim Students Association to debate the motion This House Believes Heaven is a Place on Earth. We will need 1-2 student speakers if you are interested, you may have a chance to speak! We also have a debate planned with The Eliz during the Hilary Semester.

Publications:

- We hope to publish an online Zine before Christmas break, featuring photography; creative writing; opinion pieces; and the winning pieces delivered at the Gasta competition.
- At the end of the year, we hope to publish a hard copy academic journal featuring the winners of the annual paper competition, including winners from the last few years.

Your Programme: the structure

1st Year: set modules - a foundation of knowledge in various perspectives

2nd Year: Pathway Choice – specialize; take on a language, a New Minor;

broaden through Open Modules and Trinity Electives

3rd Year: Study Abroad; broaden and specialize

4th Year: Capstone Project; 10 credit modules

Your Programme: Year One ...

... provides you with an overview and foundational knowledge in these areas:

Ethics and Politics of Religion

Study of Religion & the World's Religions

Passing First Year

1st & 2nd Year: marks do not count for the final degree → try out, find out, experiment, learn ... **BUT**: get to **know the rules!** → not submitting work or missing exams will get you into trouble; "study abroad" requires good marks
