Post Summary

The Research Fellow to join an interdisciplinary team working on the use of locative games for cultural heritage sites. The project, entitled <u>LoGaCulture</u>, is funded through Horizon Europe and has partners from four European countries. The TCD team is led by Prof. Mads Haahr and is conducting research, design and development in locative games and interactive digital narrative. The Research Fellow is expected to be a highly experienced true multidisciplinarian who can take an active leadership role in the project.

Standard Duties and Responsibilities of the Post

The duties involve research, design and software development in the area of location-based games for cultural heritage. The researcher will be liaising with other project partners, including cultural heritage institutions. The researcher will also be expected to manage TCD's responsibilities in the project on an everyday basis.

The Selection Process in Trinity

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area. Applications will be acknowledged by email. If you do not receive confirmation of receipt within 1 day of submitting your application online, please contact the named hiring lead on the job specification immediately and prior to the closing date/time.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist. Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.

In some instances the Selection Committee may avail of telephone or video conferencing. The University's selection methods may consist of any or all of the following: Interviews, Presentations, Psychometric Testing, References and Situational Exercises.

It is the policy of the University to conduct pre-employment medical screening/full preemployment medicals. Information supplied by candidates in their application (Cover Letter and CV) will be used to shortlist for interview.
