### **Module Learning Aims and Outcomes:**

On successful completion of this module, students will be able to:

- distinguish between key concepts such as migration, mobility and transnationalism;
- explain and critically discuss the main theories of migration;
- discuss and evaluate the links between migration, globalisation, securitization and the economy;
- critically engage and examine current empirical research and policy documents in the field of migration.

### **Module Content:**

This module examines key forms of contemporary international movement, migrations, mobilities and transnationalism. We begin with an overview of the main migration phases globally before moving on to explore particular aspects of contemporary migration such as intra-European mobility, high skilled migration, irregular migration and lifestyle migration. Conceptual and empirical discussions will be linked to wider social transformations including the economic downturn, globalisation, securitization and skills mobility.
