Post Summary

We seek to appoint **a postdoctoral researcher** to join the Centre for Sociology of Humans and Machines (SOHAM), which is directed by Professor Taha Yasseri and to join the team working on the IRC-Funded project ANNETTE (Artificial Intelligence Enhanced Collective Intelligence). The appointment is a specific purpose contract, to commence on 1st September 2025 or shortly thereafter.

The successful candidate will have a background in Computer Science, Computer Engineering, Informatics, Data Science, Computational Social Science, or adjacent disciplines with research experience in agent-based modelling, social data science, or social network analysis and with advanced computational skills and interest in the sociology of collective intelligence and human-machine systems.

Project Description

Artificial Intelligence Enhanced Collective Intelligence (ANNETTE) examines the opportunities for enhancing collective intelligence through the deployment of artificial intelligence (AI) as a "team manager" and as a "team-mate" in crowd-based collaborative projects. ANNETTE will use behavioural experiments and agent-based simulation, combined with machine learning, to examine how collective intelligence can be enhanced by AI, particularly in two cases of collaborative content moderation on social media platforms and volunteer-based citizen science projects. ANNETTE will advance state-of-the-art teamwork and group organisation by bridging the fast-developing field of AI technologies.
