





WHERE WILL YOU SEARCH?



- Databases.
- Reference lists from articles.
- Grey literature (PhD theses, government/company/organisation websites, conference proceedings etc.).
- Other (social media for example).

DATABASES



- Trinity College Dublin Library subscribes to 1000+ databases.
- Most databases cover a range of publication types.
- Material is reliable, authoritative and scholarly.
- You can access them from home with your College username and password.
- Set up your own account to save searches and to receive alerts.

Google is not a substitute for using the Library's quality assured databases

LEAN LIBRARY



- Download the Lean Library extension to provide quick and simple access to digital content purchased by the Library of Trinity
 College Dublin. Install the extension, select *Trinity College Dublin*, and it will automatically detect when you are on a website that contains content the Library subscribes to.
- It gives you the Trinity version of Google Scholar and makes it much easier to find PDFs when you start in Google, Google Scholar, PubMed and so on.





All Databases for European Studies

- Academic Search Complete Best Bet
 The world's largest academic multi-disciplinary database. Provides full text access to over 4,600 full text and 3,600 peer-reviewed journals across a broad range of subjects areas.
- DARE: Digital Atlas of the Roman Empire
 Map of the Roman Empire, created in 2012, by the Department of
 Archaeology and Classical History, Lund University, Sweden. Based on
 Barrington Atlas of the Greek and Roman World (Talbert, 2000) DARE
 integrates satellite imagery, national topographic maps, source texts,
 other source material and scholarly literature. Since 2012 includes UK
 based heritage databases Pastscape, Canmore and Coflein. Includes
 rendering of natural and semi natural areas (forest, grassland etc.) and
 bathymetry. Contains zoom level, i. e. zoom level 11. The Digital Atlas
 and its place database is an active project which is updated at least
 once a month. In 2015, 822 places were added.
- Europa: Gateway to the European Union Best Bet
 Links to EU documents, from legal texts to historical records, the latest
 EU-wide surveys and opinion polls.

FINDING THE LITERATURE



To search systematically you need to use:

- Controlled Vocabulary (where available).
- Keywords
 - including synonyms, variant spellings, and phrase searching.
- Boolean Operators (AND, OR).

SEARCH STRINGS: CONTROLLED VOCABULARY



- Subject terms assigned to units of information.
- Some databases have names for their controlled vocabulary (e.g. MeSH, Emtree).
- In other databases, the terms will be listed under a heading such as subject terms (e.g. in Academic Search Complete) or thesaurus (e.g. in ERIC).
- Not all databases have controlled vocabulary (e.g. JSTOR and Web of Science).

SEARCH STRINGS: KEYWORD SEARCHING (YOUR OWN WORDS)




- Controlled vocabulary retrieves all items indexed under a particular topic but can miss out on jargon, slang, newer terms and the very latest articles if subject terms have not yet been assigned.
- Your own keyword searching (repeating the controlled vocabulary term) in the Title/Abstract field will pick up on jargon, slang, newer terms and the very latest articles.
- To get the best results, use a combination of the two (where both options are available).

Tip: Keep your own keyword terms in a word document so you can copy and paste them into the different databases.

SEARCH STRINGS: BOOLEAN OPERATORS





Using OR, the student can find resources that in-

clude information about vegan diets,

vegetarian diets, and resources that discuss both.

Using NOT, the student can find

resources that only discuss vegan diets.

Using AND, the student can find

resources that include information

about both vegan and vegetarian diets.

TO BROADEN A SEARCH



Use the operator <u>OR</u> to combine synonyms, variant spellings etc.:

- back pain OR back ache OR backache.
- organisation OR organization.

Truncate your search term:

therap* = therapy; therapies; therapeutic; therapeutics.

Remove some search terms, or use more general terms

TO NARROW A SEARCH



Use the operator <u>AND</u>:

back pain AND back ache

Phrase searching - put your phrase in quotation marks:

"back pain" AND "back ache"

RESEARCH QUESTION EXAMPLE



What effect has Covid 19 had on student motivation?

PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER



((DE "Covid 19" OR DE "COVID-19 pandemic" OR TI (Covid* OR coronavir*) OR AB (Covid* OR coronavir*))

AND

((DE "ACADEMIC motivation" OR TI ("academic motivation" OR "student motivation") OR AB ("academic motivation" OR "student motivation"))

SEARCH STRATEGY (SUMMARY)



- Break down your research question into concepts.
- Use the database's controlled vocabulary (thesaurus/subject terms)
 if available.
- Apply your own keywords using as many synonyms as you can think of and put them into a Word document.
- Avail of the truncation symbol and consider phrase searching.
- Use Boolean Operators remembering "OR" is more and "AND" is less.
- Start building your search.

NEXT STEPS



- Document the search strategy.
- Record what research was found.
- Manage your references (EndNote).
- Screen your references (Covidence).
