Unit18 is the first dedicated physical space provided by Trinity College Dublin for civic and community engagement. Located on the Trinity East campus, it is designed as a place for local residents of all ages and backgrounds to meet, learn, socialise and have fun. Since opening this 300+ square metre ground-floor unit, we have continued to welcome new and diverse groups and co-develop new programmes

#### Vision

The vision for Unit18, working in partnership with stakeholders on the Trinity East site and within the wider local community, is to deliver social, cultural, education and economic benefits to residents in the area, focusing on three key strands – Employment, Education and Skills; Arts and Culture; and Civic and Community.
