Erasmus - Planning and Researching

- Each of your subjects may have Erasmus exchange partnership with host universities
- You can apply for an Erasmus place with each of your TJH subjects –you can apply to more than one exchange
 - For example - if you are on English and French Joint Honours you can apply for an English Erasmus place and a French Erasmus place
 - The university does not need to have a partnership with both subjects - it is your responsibility to research if you can study modules in your second subject at your host university
- Please check with your Departments for further information
 - They may have specific application criteria
 - They may have their own policy regarding their partnership exchange
 - Deadlines may vary with each subject

- Open to all eligible students at Trinity and is very competitive.
- Check with Trinity Global for deadlines – usually early Semester 1

- It is your responsibility to research if you can study both of your subjects at your host university, and fulfil any Capstone or Module pre-requisites
- Students can apply for both Erasmus and International Exchange
- Think carefully when accepting an offer as you should not hold onto more than one offer



You will fill in one centralised form but your Departments will review your applications and make nominations.

You will apply, using centralised form, to Trinity Global. Keep an eye on their Social media for information on drop in sessions in the hub.

Pathways and their impact on Erasmus and Study Abroad

As a TJH student you are expected to study your subject(s) while on exchange.

- You will choose your final degree pathway as part of progression to the Junior Sophister year.
- You have to mirror the ECTS requirements of your pathway
- Please consider any potential Capstone pre-requisite requirements
- Your Learning Agreement **must** be approved by your Mobility Coordinator(s) and this office (UCAO) before you go on exchange
- Your final degree award is based on your final two years, Junior Sophister is weighted at 30% and Senior Sophister is 70%

Additional Considerations



- Sustainability – slow travel, buy second-hand considerations
- If necessary, students may leave their exchange provided they can return to Trinity before 4 week of teaching at Trinity.
- Exceptions/Front-loading – need permission from both Departments and UCAO – your responsibility to ensure you are registered to correct modules in Trinity
 - The majority of subjects cannot accommodate this
- You must take reassessment opportunities available to you at your host university – research timelines, format etc. You cannot be reassessed in Trinity.
- This session is just to get you thinking – we'll cover more detail next year when you have more context
