There were also often second hand clothing markets on during the weekends (I recommend following 'vestkanttorvet' to see about times and locations).
Overall advice - Would you recommend this exchange Absolutely! The cold weather can be tough, but the nature is absolutely beautiful and Norweigens are very outdoorsy people so it you are interested in hiking or skiing or just being outdoors it is definitely a country to consider. The cost of living is very high and this is something to be aware of before going. I found the rent and public transport to be cheaper than Dublin but food, nightlife and many other things are more expensive. You will need a lot more
than the Erasmus grant.
