





Erasmus - Planning and Researching

- Each of your subjects may have partnerships with host universities
- You can apply to each of your TJH subjects which means you can apply to more than one exchange
 - E.g. if you are on English and French Joint Honours you can apply for an English Erasmus place and a French Erasmus place
- Please check with your Departments for further information
 - They may have specific application criteria
 - They may have their own policy regarding their partnership exchange
 - Deadlines may vary with each Subject

- Students can apply for both Erasmus and International Exchange
- You cannot accept two exchanges so think carefully

Pathways and their impact on Erasmus and Study Abroad

As a TJH student you are expected to study your subject(s) while on exchange.

- You will choose your final degree pathway as part of progression to the Junior Sophister year.
- You have to mirror the ECTS requirements of your pathway
- Please consider any potential Capstone pre-requisite requirements
- Your Learning Agreement for your Trinity-sanctioned exchange <u>must</u> be approved by your Exchange Coordinator(s) and this office (UCAO) before you go on exchange or within 4 weeks of arrival
- Your final degree award is based on your final two years, Junior Sophister is weighted at 30% and Senior Sophister is 70%

Pathway Choices ECTS Requirements for Exchanges

- You are expected to take the recommended amount of ECTS per pathway
- Two half-year exchanges are treated as two separate half-year exchanges, two Learning Agreements etc
- Single Honours pathway you do not take Open Modules while abroad

Joint Honours Pathway

Pathway Credits/ECTS Requirements

Full Year Exchange

You are expected to take 30 ECTS in each subject

Half-Year/One Semester exchange

- You are expected to 15 ECTS in each subject
- E.g. if a Student is taking English and History Joint Honours and going on Erasmus in Semester 2 Erasmus they need to take:



Major with Minor Pathway - Option A (continue minor in Year 4)

Credits/ECTS Requirements


Full year – 40 ECTS in Major and 20 ECTS in Minor

■ Example - If you are on the Italian Major and Spanish Minor Option A pathway on a full year exchange you need:



Half year/One Semester – 20 ECTS in Major and 10 ECTS in Minor

■ Example if you are on the Italian Major and Spanish Minor Option A pathway on a Semester 1 Erasmus exchange you need:



Major with Minor Pathway - Option B (finish minor in Year 3)


Credits/ECTS Requirements

Full Year Exchange

☐ You are expected to take 30 ECTS in Major and Minor subjects

Half-Year/One Semester exchange

- You are expected to 15 ECTS in Major and Minor subjects
- Example if you are taking Law and Business and going on Erasmus in Semester 2 Erasmus you will need to take:



Single Honours Pathway (60 ECTS)

Credits/ECTS Requirements

Full Year Exchange

60 ECTS

E.g. if you are on the English Single Honour pathway you will need to take

Half year/One Semester Exchange – 30 ECTS

- You do not need to take Open Modules
 - □All modules must be approved by your Exchange Coordinator

Student Learning Agreement Process

- Erasmus Online Learning Agreement (OLA)
- International/Non-EU Exchanges via the appropriate document
- Your Student Learning Agreement must be reviewed and approved by:
 - By the Exchange coordinator(s) for your subject
 - By the UCAO office for pathway compliance
 - before you go on exchange or within 4 weeks of arrival
- Then it should be approved by your host university
- We will email you throughout the year so please keep an eye on your Trinity email
- Risk of not being pathway compliant is failing your exchange and the consequence is having to repeat your JS year in full

When your Exchange is Finished...

- Send your Transcript of Results to UCAO via online form
- We forward it to your Exchange Coordinator(s) who will convert your results
- All students are assessed on best ECTS (irrespective of pathway):
 - Full year 45 ECTS
 - Half year /One Semester 20 ECTS
- Assessment Results will be published:
 - Semester 1 Exchange Annual Assessment Session
 - Full year or Semester 2 Exchange Reassessment Session

Items of note

- Two half-year exchanges? Please check with your Disciplines if permitted
 - Ensure timelines and start/end dates align
 - Two separate half-year exchanges for pathway requirements and two Learning Agreements
- Exceptions/Front-loading need permission from both Departments and UCAO – your responsibility to ensure you are registered to correct modules in Trinity
 - Not all Subjects can accommodate this
 - Must gain permission before OME opens
- You must take reassessment opportunities available to you at your host university – research timelines, format etc
- If the worst happens and you want to leave your exchange you should return to Trinity before 4 week of Trinity Semester starting
