MEMORANDUM TO STUDENTS

JAMES HAIRE MEMORIAL PRIZES

2023-24

In 2002, the Irish School of Ecumenics Trust established the James Haire Memorial Prizes, in memory of the late Revd. Professor James Haire, former Principal of Union Theological College, Belfast.

Seven prizes are awarded annually, two in each of the Contextual Theologies and Interfaith Relations, International Peace Studies and Conflict Resolution and Reconciliation courses. Each prize will be worth €100. In each MPhil programme one prize will be offered for the highest mark in a dissertation, and one for the highest essay marks. In each case the prize for the dissertation will be awarded first, and the winner of that prize may not be considered for award of the essay prize.

Awards will be made by the appropriate Court of Examiners, whose decision will be final.

International Student Checklist

Read our guide for International Students

The guide has all the essential information you need if you are coming to study in Northern Ireland and covers accommodation, visas, working and more. You can find it on the <u>International Students page</u>.

Let us know your date of arrival in Belfast

If you are travelling on a UK student visa we are required to know your date of arrival. Remember not to travel before the start date on your visa. Please send a copy of your ticket or other evidence of your arrival date to sradmblfst@tcd.ie.

Collect your Biometric Residence Permit (if applicable) after you arrive in Belfast

If you are getting a BRP card you will need to collect it from the main Post Office branch in High Street, Belfast. You may have a digital visa instead of a BRP card.

Send a photograph of both sides of your BRP card or the verification code for your digital visa

We are required to keep a copy for our records. Please send to the office via the email address above.

Tell us your term time address and contact telephone number

You can add your term time contact details to your student record through your Trinity portal. Please also pass your contact details to the CRR office once you know your address in Belfast.

Register with a doctor

A UK student visa entitles you to access the national health service. It's a good idea to register with a GP practice at the start of term in case you need medical attention at a later stage.

Opening a bank account

Once you are fully registered and can show evidence of your term time address we can provide a letter confirming your student status and address to help you open a bank account. Or you might like to try digital banks like Monzo, Revolut, The Chase, or Wise.

Attendance records

We are required to keep attendance records for students on visas and will advise you how we are going to do this at the start of term.

Bring your ID if you are travelling south of the border

Very rarely there can be ID checks on public transport travelling south of the border. It's a good idea to carry your Trinity ID and BRP with you. Your student ID card will be available as an app on your phone.

Short Irish Visitor Visas

Some students will need a short Irish visitor visa to travel between Belfast and Dublin during the year (in addition to the UK visa). You can apply for this online after arrival in Northern Ireland. Find out more in the Guide for International Students. You can take the CRR course without needing to go to Dublin!

Records kept for students on a UK visa (copies of BRP and passport) are stored according to the College Data Protection Policy.

- Extra steps to scan a book on the flatbed feeder where you want all the pages to scan into one document:
 - Hit Settings Source Flatbed Scanner Multiple pages
 - o Scan your first page, then load page 2, Scan and hit OK and so on
 - After the last page select Done
- The scanner creates a folder named HPSCANS on your USB drive, and it saves the file in .PDF or.JPG format using an automatically generated file name.

FIRE EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

Upon Discovering a Fire:

- 1. Raise the alarm by breaking the glass at a fire alarm call point
 - 2. Dial 999 and ask for the fire brigade
- 3. If you have been trained and only if you deem it safe to do so, use the fire extinguishing equipment to fight the fire.

WARNING! do not put yourself at risk!

If you don't feel safe fighting the fire, always evacuate the building.

The fire alarm is a loud, continuous siren

when you hear the fire alarm sounding:

- 1. Leave the building through the nearest available signed exit
- 2. Walk, don't run
- 3. Do not return to collect personal items
- 4. Go to the fire assembly point in the staff and residents car park in front of the main college entrance
- 5. Do not leave the assembly point until instructed you can do so by the fire safety officer/attending fire and rescue officer in charge.

Be prepared! find out where your nearest fire exit is before you may need to use it.
