Module Outline:

Inequality and poverty are major themes the 21st century. Hence, preventing and alleviating poverty is a key concern of governments and international organisations. Defining and measuring poverty is the first step towards developing and evaluating policies to tackle it effectively. Using real world examples, this module discusses not long-standing theories of inequality and poverty as well as recent developments and debates in measurement and policy. The module reviews different concepts and measures of poverty and discusses implications for research, discourse and policy. The module will also discuss the role of social protection systems in addressing poverty in different regions in a global context.
