

- ▶ B.E.S.S. gives students the opportunity to engage with the four fields of Business, Economics, Political Science and Sociology in their first year. The option to **specialise** in either one (single honor) or two (joint honors) chosen subjects and disciplines opens up a variety of career pathways.

- > Offers excellent training in the social sciences helping students develop strong **analytical skills** and the ability to create **coherent arguments**.
- > Trinity Electives, Open Modules and Erasmus/Exchange opportunities allow students to **broaden their mindset**.
- > Various forms of continuous assessments such as essays and project work facilitate original thinking and nurture the ability to **think independently**.
- > Students gain experience in **communicating** their work to others, through either individual presentations or classroom discussions.
- > Group assignments give students experience in **collaborative work** and in incorporating disparate viewpoints into their own analyses.
- > Studying B.E.S.S. gives students an appreciation of the value of **diversity** and of the potential gain from **synthesizing information** from different sources.
