Philosophy: 12:30 to 13:30



- Synthesize a broad range of topics in modern macroeconomics

Module Learning Aims

This module builds on the foundations of EC2110 & EC2111 Intermediate Economics, developing some of the topics from that module, and introducing some new ones.

Module Content

Macroeconomics: intertemporal consumption and labour supply; investment theory; money demand; the analysis of business cycles; monetary policy; fiscal policy.

Recommended Reading List

No prescribed text, readings and cases will be provided by the lecturer throughout the module.

EC2110 & EC2111 Intermediate Economics

What happens next?

Lecture and tutorial format
