## Program Eligibility

**Undergraduate:** Bachelor of Commerce

It is strongly recommended that all applicants have successfully completed at least six foundation courses in Business and/or Economics at their home school. Students in an undergraduate program or in M1 of a Masters' program will be admitted to the Commerce program.

**Graduate:** MBA and Master of International Business (MIB)

The MBA exchange program is offered in the *fall term* only. The MIB exchange program is offered in the *winter term* only. Students must be in an MBA or in 2nd year/ M2 of a Master program in order to be admitted into either graduate program.

## Course Information

**Academic Integrity:** As a member of the Centre for Academic Integrity (CAI), Queen's subscribes to the definition of academic integrity as a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to five fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, and responsibility: smith.queensu.ca/about/academic\_integrity/index.php.

**Class Format:** Lectures, presentations, group work, and case studies

**Attendance:** Strongly recommended with some courses requiring mandatory attendance.

**Participation:** Students are encouraged to be active participants; some classes will include a participation grade.

Credit Weight: Each course consists of 36 contact hours and has a weight of 3.0 academic units.

**Work load:** Queen's courses are demanding with on-going assessment, group work and final projects and/or exams. For every hour of class time, students should plan for approximately 3.5-4.5 hours of additional independent or group work. For example, 36 class hours equals 126 to 162 hours of additional work load, for a total of 162-198 hours per course. Therefore, each 3.0 unit course = 36 hours + 162 to 198 hours = approximately 6 to 7.5 ECTS. For exchange students to succeed in a new culture with different teaching methods and perhaps using their second language, we recommend they complete 4 courses (4 x 7.5 = 30 ECTS). However, students must follow the course load requirements that are determined by their home school.

Class Size: 40 – 80 students

**Examinations:** An extra 1/2 hour and translation dictionary (not electronic dictionary) are permitted for exchange students whose first language is not English (for final exams only).

### **Undergraduate - Bachelor of Commerce**

• Students may take some courses from a different faculty other than Smith School of Business, however the majority of courses must be taken from Smith. For a listing of Commerce courses, please visit: ssb.ca/bcom\_courses.

#### **Graduate - Masters Programs**

- MBA elective (specialization) courses are run in a modular structure and begin September and continue until mid- December.
- MBA courses are listed at: smith.queensu.ca/mba\_programs/mba/about\_the\_program/index.
   php. MBA courses fall into one of six streams: consulting, entrepreneurship & innovation, finance,
   healthcare management, marketing & sales, or general management. You may choose to select
   courses from multiple streams.
- MIB elective courses will be offered in two 6-week modules from January to April.
- Exchange students must take between a minimum of 3 courses per term and a maximum of 5 courses per term. Highly recommended that MBA Exchange students take a maximum of 4 courses based on the program structure.

### Visa and Study Permit

#### **Entry Visa**

Citizens of certain countries and territories will require either a Visa or an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to visit Canada. Further information is available: cic.qc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp.

### **Study Permit**

A study permit is required for anyone who wants to study in Canada for 6 months or more. All double-degree students must obtain a study permit: cic.gc.ca/english/study/index.asp.

### You will need to provide:

- A valid passport which will still be valid for 6 months after your return home.
- Evidence of acceptance into a study program: an unconditional letter of acceptance from Queen's University offering you admission will be sent to you.
- Evidence of adequate funds to cover the cost of tuition and living expenses for you and your dependents coming to Canada with you. Evidence includes personal bank statements, letters pledging financial support from family or other sponsors or letters from your academic department offering you employment, bursary, scholarship or fellowship money. ### **Health Insurance**

### Mandatory: University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

UHIP medical insurance offers coverage for basic services like emergency hospital visits and physical examinations. UHIP does not cover supplementary medical services, such as dental work or physiotherapy. International students must have primary health insurance provided by the UHIP for the duration of their time in Canada, *uhip.ca*. Fees are subject to change from year to year.

**Optional: Supplementary Medical Insurance** covers some services that are not covered by UHIP, such as a portion of the cost of prescription medicine, physiotherapy, chiropractic care, eye examination, dental work, vision care, travel coverage and other service. Supplementary health plans are administered by both student government office: Alma Mater Society (AMS) *myams.org/health* for Commerce and MBA students, Society of Graduate and Professional Students (SGPS) *sgps. ca/* for MIB students.
