

Dear Nursing and Midwifery students.

Welcome to the School of Nursing & Midwifery at Trinity College. We are delighted that you have been offered a place on the Bachelor in Science (Nursing/Midwifery/General and Children's Nursing) programme.

The course will begin 18th September 2023 as per your course timetable.

Shortly after CAO reply date you will receive a message in your in-tray via Student Information System (SITS) access via my.tcd.ie where you will be asked to select your preferred training hospital/service for the Bachelor in Science Nursing/Midwifery course.

Please note for your information:

1. Garda Vetting

Nursing and Midwifery students on courses with clinical or other professional placements are required to undergo Garda vetting procedures prior to commencing placements. If, as a result of the outcome of the Garda vetting procedures, Nursing and Midwifery student is deemed unsuitable to attend clinical or another professional placement, he/she may be required to withdraw from his/her course.

Nursing and Midwifery students who have resided outside Ireland for a consecutive period of 6 months or more will be required to provide police clearance documentation from the country in which they resided at the time of registration.

Nursing and Midwifery students offered a place in Nursing/Midwifery in Trinity will be informed as appropriate when Garda vetting forms have been uploaded on the TCD website for completion (as part of the student orientation information). These completed forms <u>must</u> be returned to the Academic Registry as soon as possible to avoid any delay commencing clinical placements.

NB It is <u>imperative</u> students engage with all aspects of the garda vetting process at the earliest point as directed by Academic Registry. Any_delays will result in students not being permitted to commence clinical placements.

2. Registration



All Nursing and Midwifery students must be registered prior to commencing clinical placements. Therefore it is imperative students engage in the registration process at the earliest possible point.

3. NMBI Nursing/Midwifery Board of Ireland

Nursing and Midwifery students are required to register with NMBI within 30 days of commencing the programme. Registration with NMBI is a mandatory pre-requisite for all students to commence clinical placements.
