Notes on Completion of Application Form

1. The closing date for receipt of applications for admission in September is 1st March. Applications for admission in January should reach us by 30th September. Please note preference is given to applicants who commit themselves to a full year of study, including the examination period. Before completing the application form, please consult the "Module Directory" for Visiting & Erasmus Students <https://www.tcd.ie/academicregistry/study-abroad/> and ensure that you have understood the information concerning admission and study programme.

You will be assessed on the basis of your Trinity College Dublin application form and supporting documentation. **PLEASE DO NOT FORWARD ANY OTHER APPLICATION FORM OR DOCUMENTATION, EXCEPT AS REQUESTED.** Please ensure you complete all sections and use **BLOCK CAPITALS**.

2. Please include your full postal address and a contact name. Please also provide your home address.
3. If English is not your first language, you must provide evidence of your English language competence. You will need to include with your application an original or *certified true copy of one of the following: **Irish Leaving Certificate:** a grade D3 or better in Ordinary level English; **GCSE:** a grade C or better in English Language; **European Baccalaureate:** English: 6 in 1st Language, or in 1st or 2nd Foreign language; **French Baccalaureate:** Students presenting the OIB or International Option of the French Baccalaureate may satisfy the English language requirement by achieving a minimum of 12 (where the coefficient is greater than 5) in English Language and Literature. In cases where the coefficient is less than 5, a minimum result of 14 will be required; **International Baccalaureate:** English A1, A2 or B: 5 at Higher Level (4 at Standard Level if presenting IB through English); **US High School:** a grade C in English taken in final year; **TOEFL:** Paper based 570 (with a TWE score of 4.5), Computer-based 233 (with a score of 4.5 in essay), Internet based 90 (with a written score of 21); **Cambridge Proficiency:** Grade C; **Cambridge Advanced:** Grade A; **IELTS:** (Academic version) 6.5 (no individual band below 6) For Dental courses: IELTS (academic version) 7 (no individual band below 7); **Pearson Test of English (Academic) - PTE Academic:** a minimum score of 63 (with no section score below 59). <https://www.tcd.ie/study/apply/admission-requirements/undergraduate/>

4. Please use the names of the subjects (i.e. Philosophy, Geography, French, History, Political Science, etc.) you would like to study. It is **not** sufficient to put *Arts, Humanities, Science*, etc. as this does not indicate the specific subject(s) you wish to apply for. In the case of Science subjects, the following descriptions should be used: Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Geology, Zoology, etc. **Please note:** students who are accepted into modules in Science will take most of their modules in the host department. It will be possible for students to take subsidiary modules in other subjects within Science but they will not be guaranteed a place in practical laboratory modules.
5. Under the section referring to required modules, please do not list modules unless they are an absolute precondition for accepting a place at Trinity College Dublin. If you list modules which are likely to be over-subscribed, or for which the department feels that you are not sufficiently qualified, you may jeopardise your chances of acceptance.
6. Please note that acceptance of your application does not necessarily guarantee acceptance into any particular module, except as provided in note 5. You will not, in any case, finalise your module choices until after you have arrived, enrolled and met with an academic member of staff in the department(s) into which you have been accepted.

8. It is the university's policy to facilitate students with physical disabilities as far as possible, but you should note that not all parts of the campus are suitable for such students. 9. A student who is making an EU application must provide evidence of full-time post primary/third level education for 3 of the 5 years immediately preceding admission, or evidence of having worked full-time in the EU for 3 years immediately preceding admission.
10. The standard requirement for Visiting Students is a minimum of 45 ECTS credits per Academic Year, which equates to 15 ECTS credits per term. It is important to check with your home university prior to arrival as to what credits that you must take to meet their requirements. Additionally, you must complete all assessments, examinations, laboratory work, etc., associated with each module for which you are registered. If you do not complete the full workload associated with a module, your transcript will be marked 'Incomplete'.
